- Keep me honest: Have had essentially always the same job for 22 years. Still, after my Laurea degree in Italy, I begun in the phone company and teaching high school, prior to coming back to get the PhD in Mathematics. Further, I relied on former student insight (B.R.).

Placement

• PhD Placement (both Math and ACO). Last 10, 5, 2 years.

Note: About $\frac{1}{3}$ rd of Total went into non-academic positions and this is a stable proportion through the years.

- Non Academic Venues.
 - MaxPlanck, Navy, Consulting, NSA, Asset Modeling, Planning Systems, Verizon, ATT, DoD, notnow.com, Retek Inc., Dynetics, Software, LANL, DE Shaw, Bank of America, Microsoft, Citigroup, MarketRx, IT, Inform GmbH (optimization software), Pace Academy, Wachovia, Wall-Street "firms", CGG Veritas, Scoring Solutions, Kaupthing.
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 - Non-academic trends: Software, Finances, Defense related.
- **Note**: Last two years, in spite of bad overall economy: Seemingly all of our PhD students got (or are getting) a professional job!
- Why non-academic?

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 - You can get better control of where to live. An academic search is usually for the job, in a non-academic search you may be able to first choose **where** to be. Besides, in some countries (e.g., Italy) academic jobs are scarce. Or, you just want to remain in Atlanta, where there are surely more non-academic than academic jobs! [Food for thought: Atlanta is home to 13 Fortune 500 companies and over 1,000 international businesses!]

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 - You may want to have a more direct role in the community.

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 - Did you know that Georgia Tech also has a Co-op program? That some of your fellow PhD students have had Summer internships through Co-op and may have a job lined up waiting for them? http://www.coop.gatech.edu

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 - Negotiations and offers

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- What about the interviewing process?
 - [B.R.] "In defense, interviews are a lot more general and non-technical. In finance, they can be brutal. Practice lots of brain teasers, and be prepared for a lot of questions. Typical finance process: 2 or 3 phone interviews (usually involving brainteasers), maybe an online test or two, then an onsite interview that lasts all day and leaves you exhausted."

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 - Let your interests and hobbies be known to those who may have to talk about you! E.g., bike-riding, ping-pong, music, gardening, kyte flying, [My experience ...].

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 - Why?
 - Work on school year (190 days), professional pay, gratifying.
